Our objective is to honor the Lord's desire for the gathering of the saints while maintaining safe and healthy guidelines to best love our neighbor.



Every other pew is roped off to allow 6 feet distancing between households.



Sanitizing stations are available at each entrance/exit point.



Indoor worship is mask-optional for those who have been vaccinated, but we encourage those who have not been vaccinated to continue wearing masks.



Our regular Sunday practices have been altered to provide the safest environment for our folks (communion, offering, coffee, hospitality, dismissal practices, etc.).



Our in-person and livestreamed worship service will begin at 10:30AM from June 6 - Sept 5.



People who are at-risk or of compromised immunity are encouraged to use extra caution in public gatherings.



Doors will remain open as long as temperature allows. Please enter through the main sanctuary doors and exit through the doors to the left and right of the stage.



Our Children's Ministry currently offers a walker/toddlers class (1, 2 and 3-yr-olds). All other children are expected to remain with their parents in the sanctuary.

Please stay home if you have a fever or are feeling symptomatic. Church closure can happen if there is a spike in local infections.
